- renewable sources




# **District Heating Network**

#### **Success Story**

- district heating and cooling network with lake water as main heat source (total renewable energy 90%)
- example of successful policy making including long term planning in a multi-actor public-private partnership

 in accordance with federal target of net zero emissions by 2050 (Net Zero Pledge)







# DHN «Zentrum»

- Municipal energy planning paved the way for district heating networks over a decade ago
  strategic document: municipal energy plan
- □ Federal boundary conditions key to push towards renewable energy technologies
- □ Highly flexible **public-private partnership** 
  - Contract between Gas Water Thalwil (public) and E360° (private utility) with option for the municipality to become investors
  - □ Win-win solution: contracting business and renewable energy supply



□ Sustainability assessment analysing costs and benefits for the people of Thalwil
